This morning of the small snow I count the blessings, the leak in the faucet which makes of the sink time, the drop of the water on water.

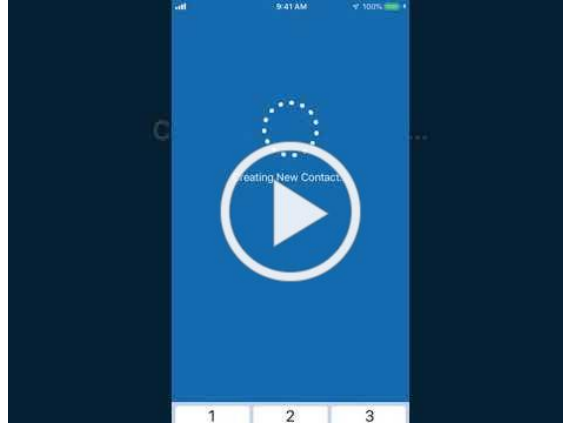

Leak Prevention and Leak Detection



Most of us have our water treatment equipment in the basement. Laundry and litter boxes send some of us down there on a regular basis but if that's not the case you may want to give yourself a weekly reminder to do a walk through. Leaks can do a lot of damage, and depending on the size of the leak, it can happen fast. A simple visual check can help catch any problems early. For extra security, consider a leak detection system. Water-Flo likes the **Kinetico leak detection system**, which actually shuts off the water in 5 seconds or less when water is detected. Check out the video above for a demonstration of the system, which consists of an app, leak detection sensors, shut off valves and a communication hub. Installing a detection system is an easy way to prevent a more costly repair.

Preventing leaks can be easy too. Look for slow leaks (your pipes shouldn't be damp!), corroded pipes (green or white deposits), degraded valves and supply lines. Call us for a water test as acidic water can cause pipes to break down and you'll see the pinhole leaks like in the video below. Question:

There's some water on the floor in the basement and I didn't get one of those leak detection systems (yet!). What do I do?

Answer:

BEFORE you have a leak, locate your main water shutoff valve and learn how to turn it on and off. In many homes, the valve is located on an exterior wall of the home, in the garage, or in the basement. If you have a public water supply, the main water valve is typically on the street-side of your home. For homeowners who have wells, the main water valve will most likely be located on the same side of the house as your well. Typically, to turn off the main water valve, you simply turn the valve handle clockwise until it stops. Closing the valve should shut off all water supply into your home in the event of a leak, or if a repair is needed. Now hang something bright on it so you can find it quickly in an emergency. The source of the leak will determine whether you need to call your plumber or Water-Flo!
