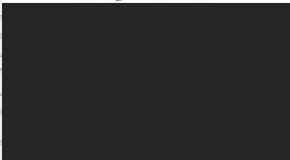

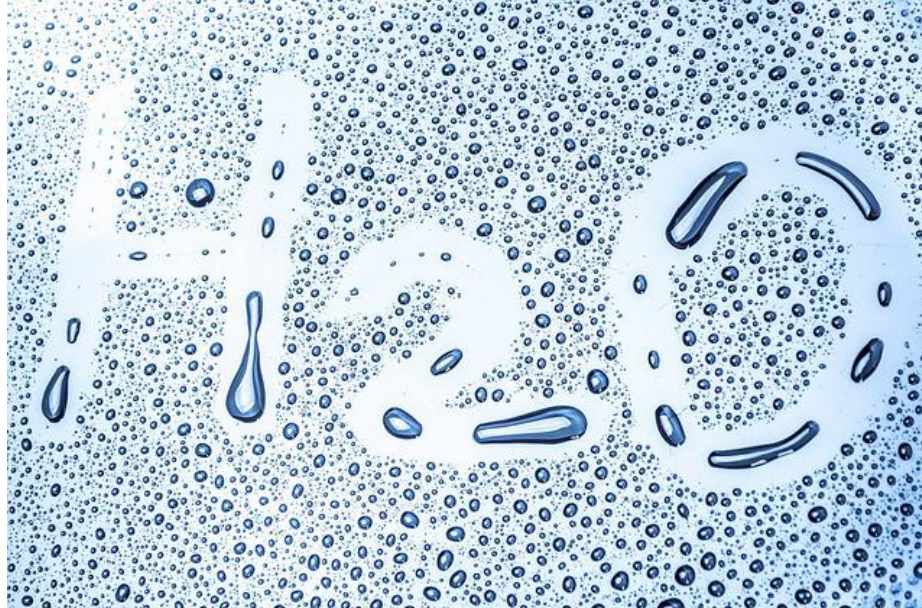


Water-Flo Gives Back

During the month of June, we are encouraging our local community, friends, and family to join us for a 30 day water conservation challenge to celebrate our 30th year in business! How are you doing so far?

Here are a few more tips to help you reduce your water usage:

- Install rain barrels- this was a team member project and another member already had two! Rain barrels are great for watering plants, gardens and filling water features. In case of a summer power outage, rain barrel users will have plenty of water for flushing toilets! Often local garden clubs will sell them as a fund raiser and there are plenty of choices from functional to aesthetically pleasing.
- Plant a rain garden. Rain gardens are beautiful options to collect and clean run off. This website has some ideas: [Garden Design](#)
- Be mindful- this time of year we see an increase in "self-induced" water outages. Filling the pool or hot tub can drain your well. Purchasing water is a better option for filling pools and keep them covered to reduce evaporation. Watering the yard or garden and accidentally leaving the hose on overnight can also result in a dry well. Normally the well will refill over time but running it dry can damage your equipment resulting in a necessary repair.
- Washing the car- commercial car washes are far more efficient than pulling out the hose at home. You can find information about the technology they use here: [Earth911](#). If you are going to wash the car at home, park the car in the grass so the water is not lost to the drain basins.
- In the kitchen- clean vegetables in a bowl of water rather than under running water.

Ask The Expert

Question:

I filled my hot tub and now I've got no water from my well- what do I do?

Answer:

If you are going to fill your hot tub or pool with well water, first, bypass your treatment systems so you are not overtaxing them. Second, run the water at a VERY slow rate- less than a gallon a minute. If you've already run the well dry, the water level has gotten below the level of the submersible pump. Turn off all open taps and the main water valve to the house and wait 30 minutes. Turn the valve back on and if you have water again the water level recovered and you will need to be mindful of your water usage in the future. If you still don't have water, give Water-Flo a call!
